



Civil wedding required documentation

- Original and copy of both the Bride and Groom's birth certificate.
- If divorced, a certificate decree from the Mexican Consular Office.
- Current passport with tourist card or visa (make copies of each).
- Four legally qualified witnesses (over 18) must be present.
- Valid Passports for all four witnesses.
- Tourist Visa Cards (Groom, Bride and Witnesses. You will receive them upon your arrival at the airport).
- A blood test performed in Mexico (the CRO will recommend a doctor/clinic). Results and certification incur a \$200 USD fee, to be paid in cash directly to the doctor.
- Foreigners wishing to marry Mexican citizens must obtain authorization from the National Institute of Migration.
- Fill out an application stating your information and scan a copy of your required documents as soon as possible, one month before the wedding at the latest.
- The Bride, Groom & four witnesses must meet at the Resort at least 3 working days prior the date of the wedding with required documents.

Please note: All foreign documents (birth certificate, divorce decree, death certificate, etc.) are to be submitted to Mexican Officials must be legally translated to Spanish (to be done in Mexico) and certified via an Apostille for legal purposes.

An Apostille is an Internationally-recognized notary certification, completed in the country of origin, and issued by the State Department. If traveling from the United States, contact your State's Secretary; If traveling from Canada, contact your nearest Mexican Embassy and inquire an authentication document that serves the same purpose as an Apostille.

We suggest you travel with at least one complete set of copies, plus the original file.
